### **Purpose**

Use shortcut keys to quickly navigate through the interface. By leveraging the Hot Keys sheet, you define shortcut key combinations used within the current program. You can then select shortcut keys for specific functions.



## **Helpful Hints**

- Remember that you can right click on a field to drill into more details.
- Fields that have a pull down beside them indicate that there is a valid list of values that you can select from. You can enter the value by typing if you already know the value.





#### **Procedure**


Anywhere in the application for Setup or General Operations you will be able to access Tools > Options > Hot Keys.

You can personalize each program's interface so it displays the configuration that works best for you.




#### Menu Path

Tools > Options > Select Hot keys





The options you select become the default for the program each time you launch it!

**Example:** You want to use a shortcut key combination to clear a record. On the Hot Keys sheet, you select the clear command from the list.




Select Ctrl + Q from the Short Cut list.






You cannot assign the same shortcut to more than one command. When the warning message displays, you can either retain the existing assignments or assign the existing shortcut to the selected command while clearing the shortcut for the previous command. Shortcuts can be same at the Form and Global level.

Note: if the short cut already exist you will receive an error message





#### Example 2


You may want to set up a Command for Search in a program, keep in mind it will only work on the form and in the funtion area for this hot key.



If you wish to activate a more global setting then you would go to Global Hot Keys
